Mrs. Squire overcame her challenges and became a successful author of mystery novels.

Purpose: This NC IDA scholarship is offered to provide funds for parents, adults, students, and teachers who seek to understand and address the needs of individuals with the language-based learning disability known as dyslexia.

Use of Funds: The scholarship funds can be used to attend workshops, conferences, and training sessions sponsored by NCIDA (see website for NCIDA sponsored events www.nc-ida.org).

Application Process: The applicant must write a request letter to the NC IDA Scholarship Committee including the required information listed below in advance of the deadline. Please include as much detail as you are able for the committee to review. All information will be kept in strictest confidence by the NC IDA. Scholarship funds will be awarded six weeks prior to the event.
